

"What Are You Going To Do With Jesus?"

Luke 23:1-25 – Jesus stands trial before Pilate.

In the last week of Jesus' life, there are a few characters (people) that are very key players leading up to the Crucifixion. One of them is named Pilate!

1. Who is Jesus?

- In Matthew 16:13-18 "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God!"
- In Luke 23:1-3, Pilate asks Jesus who He is! "Are you the king of the Jews?" // "Jesus replied, "You have said it."
- Pilate starts out in verse 4 by saying that he sees nothing wrong with Jesus!
- The Jewish leaders were angry! Jesus then gets sent to Herod.
- Herod began mocking Jesus and ridiculing Him. They mockingly put a royal robe on Jesus and sent Him back to Pilate.
- The Bible says that Herod and Pilate...who were enemies...became friends that day!

 What you now have is an unholy alliance against the Holy One!
- Verse 14 Pilate still finds Jesus innocent. / Verse 15 "Nothing this man has done calls for the Death Penalty."
- Verse 16 "So I will have him flogged, and then release him."
- Jeremiah 17:9 "The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and is DESPERATELY WICKED."
- Would you have an innocent man beaten by 39 lashes with a whip that has 9 tails of lead tips on it? That is 351 open lash wounds! Jesus took that for you!
- Pilate is a crowd pleaser! He does not believe that Jesus is the Messiah!
- Luke 23:18 The crowd was very angry at Pilate and yells to murder Jesus!
- <u>WOW</u> They want an actual convicted murderer released named Barabbas and want Jesus killed!
- Luke 23:20-25 Pilate sentences Jesus to die! But, I believe that Jesus was dealing with Pilate's heart! Why? Verse 20!
- But...

2. What Pilate did to Jesus revealed his true heart!

- Luke 23:24 25 Pilate sentences Jesus to death and releases a convicted murderer!
- Pilate showed what his heart and life were really like right here once again...wicked!
- He <u>LOOKS</u> like he is sympathetic, but he is actually a wicked man!
- <u>He caves into the crowd and political pressure!</u> He was Governor! He did not want to cause an uproar in his region!
- He had no excuse or evidence to have Jesus flogged let alone die!
- Mark 15:15 He was all about <u>satisfying / pacifying</u> the crowd!
- John 19:12 He was also <u>afraid</u> that he would get in trouble...black mailed!
- It is a true tragedy when we fail to recognize the Truth! Jesus is the Truth! John 14:6
- Pilate denied the Truth by his very own actions...by denying Jesus!
- James 4:17! Pilate missed his opportunity to honor God <u>by failing to do right!</u>

A. Interesting...3 different times Pilate declared Jesus not guilty!

- But, the pressure of <u>PUBLIC DEMAND</u> caused him to cave into wickedness again!
- <u>Max Lucado</u> "Pilate thought that he could avoid making a choice. He washed his hands of Jesus. He climbed on the fence and sat down. But, in not making a choice, Pilate made a choice. Rather than ask for God's grace, he asked for a bowl. Rather than invite Jesus to stay, he sent him away. Rather than hear Christ's voice, he heard the voice of the people."
- Matthew 27:19 "Pilate sitting in the judgment seat..." / "Pilate's wife begs him to leave Jesus alone as he is innocent."
- Matthew 27:22-26 Pliate washes his hands of Jesus!
- Verse 24 The bowl of washing becomes a bowl GUILTY!
- By washing his hands of Jesus, Pilate actually condemns himself of innocent blood!
- See, Pilate declared that he was innocent of this man's (Jesus) blood on his hands! But, actually, Pilate was guilty with blood on his hands that he would <u>never be able to wash</u> <u>off</u>...for Eternity!

Closing: Everyone one of us must decide what we are going to do with Jesus!

- A person might be able to wash their hands in front of everyone with Jesus...but the heart still remains guilty!
- The Question is this today "What Are You Going To Do With Jesus?"
- See, there is no amount of water that can wash your guilt away! It is actually only by the precious <u>blood</u> of Jesus Christ!
- The irony in all of this? The very blood that Pilate decided to spill was the very blood that forgives all sin and he missed it!
- What do we learn from Pilate? A river runs crooked by following the line of least resistance!
- The Holy Spirit gives a person the power to not satisfy the crowd, but follow Jesus!
- Pilate tried to let everyone else decide for him what to do with Jesus.
- You have to decide what you are going to do with Jesus today.
