

"The Welcoming Father!"

The Parable of the Prodigal Son can actually be called the "Parable of the Welcoming Father!"

- Luke 15:11-32
- The <u>repentance of the son</u> is the focus to the parable! When a person chooses to live a sinful and rebellious lifestyle, and then finally chooses God...that is Good News when they finally realize their own horrible sinful state!
- The <u>father's willingness to forgive</u> his son in this parable is of greater focus!
- Why? Without the forgiveness of the Father...the son would never be able to come home!
- <u>Please know this</u>...there can never be forgiveness unless there is repentance first!
- What a picture of Jesus showing us how the Heavenly Father's love towards us sinners is forgiven when we turn to Him!
- The Heavenly Father is eager to forgive and longs for the return of the repentant sinner!
- Yet, we also see an older brother in this parable who is self-righteous and refuses to celebrate when the lost son comes home to the father!
- Jesus is addressing the Pharisee's prejudice they are living when it comes to a lost sinner coming back to the Heavenly Father! (The older brother in the story)
- The Pharisee's and Scribes absolutely resented Jesus' mission on coming from the Heavenly Father to seek out sinners and bring them into God's family!

1. A father and two sons!

- Luke 15:11-12
- In the Mosaic law (Law of Moses), the firstborn son is entitled to two-thirds of his father's property (Deuteronomy 21:17). <u>But, what is happening here is very unusual!</u> To give the property to a son <u>before</u> the father's death almost never happened, and for a son to request it would be very insulting to the father!
- Basically..."I wish you were dead already dad...I just want my portion!"
- The son takes one-third of the inheritance and leaves. Verse 13
- What a picture here of the sinner who doesn't care for the Heavenly Father, abandons the Heavenly Father and begins to waste his life living in sin!
- Mark the Word of God today...when you abandon the Heavenly Father, you don't just waste away your inheritance, but you will end up in gross, sinful immorality! Verses 16 & 30
- Psalm 19:12-14 the <u>Downward Spiral of sin!</u> It gets worse!

- Verse 13 "Wild or Prodigal!" / Prodigal = "Dissolute" which means utterly debauched lifestyle and promiscuous sexual activity. Sexual sin!
- Remember...this is not what he just did to himself...this is what he did to his own father, family and the Heavenly Father!
- Verse 14 his sinful lifestyle finally catches up to him!
- Verse 16 "But no one gave him anything!"
- FACT: Sin will leave you with nothing! The people that you run with in your sin life...they won't be there for you! When it comes to someone else giving you something...they will just think of themselves!
- Verse 15-16 <u>swine</u> (<u>pigs</u>) are the worst kind of <u>unclean</u> animal according to the Jews!
 (<u>Leviticus 11:7</u>)
- Jesus is showing his Jewish audience that even the <u>worst sinful actions</u> and <u>sinner</u> out there can be forgiven by the Heavenly Father <u>IF</u> they choose to repent!
- Verse 17-18 "I will go home to my father"..." Father, I have sinned against both Heaven and you...I am no longer worthy being called your son." "Please take me on as a hired servant."
- This son, as horrible and gross of sins that he committed, <u>KNEW</u> that his father was a <u>GOOD FATHER</u>! That he could return to him and at least not die!

Verse 20!!!!!! Here is <u>THE</u> picture of the Heavenly Father just waiting on the sinner to come home!

- Verses 21-23 shows the father's complete forgiveness and restoration of the relationship with his son...his sinful son who repented!
- <u>LOL</u> in his excitement and joy of the return of his son...<u>he literally interrupts the son's</u> rehearsed apology! <u>Verse 21</u>
- Notice what is left out "Please take me on as your hired servant."
- Instead of making his son a servant, the father in verse 22 says to the servants..."Quick!"
- Verse 22 "Best robe" / "Ring" / "Shoes or Sandals"
- Best robe = a true mark of distinction!
- Ring = signifies authority as a son not a servant!
- Shoes or Sandals = servants do not wear sandals...the sandals point to a free man!

Closing: The point of the Parable?

- Verses 24 / 32 "For this son of mine was dead and has now returned to life! He was lost, but now is found!"
- Sin = spiritual death forever! Separated from God forever!
- To go from death to life is <u>THE MIRACLE</u> of this life! <u>Salvation!!!</u> The <u>best GIFT</u> ever from God!
- Ephesians 2:1-5! Ephesians 2:8-10!
- The Welcoming Heavenly Father!
